Please Welcome Our New HHSAA Board Member! <u>Stoner Horey '64</u>

Stoner is a proud graduate of the class of 1964. In fact, his class is the first group of students to graduate from the new high school! After graduation, Stoner continued his education at Hamilton College in Clinton, NY. During his summer months, he worked on Erie Railroad section gangs which involved the complete gamut of railroad maintenance. This was the 4th generation of the Horey men to work on the Erie Railroad. Stoner went to medical school and graduated cum laude from Georgetown University School of Medicine in 1972, followed by three years of internship & residency at the University of Rochester.

Stoner returned to Hornell in 1975 and practiced private care medicine for twenty-five (25) years. He was also an elective legislator (1986-2000) of which he served as chairman for eight years. At the age of 48, Stoner had an aortic dissection. After 20 years of having this surgery, he remains in inexplicably good health....but can no longer stuff a basketball!

In 2000, Stoner left his private practice and was appointed by Govenor Pataki to serve as Assistant Commissioner of Economic Development. As part of that activity, he worked on the 9-11 recovery in New York City. Three years later, Stoner was appointed Director of Geriatrics at the Bath VA. He assisted in the hurricane recovery of Wilma and Katrina in 2005, and received the Hero's Award from the Secretary of the VA.


After serving six years at the VA, Stoner became a hospitalist in Hornell, Wellsville, and Bath. He has been a member of the Board of Directors at Steuben Trust Company for the past twenty years, and more recently, has served on the Executive Board of Directors.



The Hornell High School Alumni tradition strives to encourage and support life-styles that have strong work ethics, service, and achievement by rewarding students who exemplify these characteristics with recognition and financial assistance for their education.

A silent committee serves at the pleasure of the President of the Alumni This group is always kept confidential. It may come as a surprise but this is truly a secret committee and never discussed. Board members don't have a clue! A meeting is called by the Superintendent of Schools and the President of the Alumni Board.

The silent committee, school officials, teachers, and guidance counselors meet for the first time. Every senior is offered an opportunity to fill out an application.

The Superintendent provides detailed resume of all students: student class ranking, financial need, student activities, desire for higher education (school choice), cost, student character, personality, and potential leadership.

All selections are final. No records leave the school and resumes of the students are returned and kept confidential.





H.H.S.A.A. Endowment Fund

The Hornell High School Alumni Association is a recognized charitable organization under the rules and regulations of the I.R.S. The HHS Alumni Association is a 501 (C) (3) charitable organization so that donations made to it are deductible.

Since approximately 1995, the Alumni Association hired Steuben Trust Company to provide investment management services through a Trust Agreement for some of its excess money. The fund has grown in value due to its diversified investments between fixed

income and equity investments. Since it has grown in value, it enables the Alumni Association to grant more scholarships.

Spring has sprung or at least the calendar indicates spring is here. It has been a harsh winter, and it seems to be lingering longer than any of us would like. The 2014-2015 school year will be coming to a close shortly. It has been an exciting one.

We are reaching the end of the 2008 Capital Project which saw many improvements to our facilities. During the course of this past




year, the Board of Education, our community committee, and administrative team examined the facility needs of our district. The Board of Education has approved putting another capital project out to the voters. If a successful vote occurs in May, you will see much needed renovations to our swimming pool, our Junior/ Senior High School gymnasiums, additional secured entrances in the Intermediate & Columbian Schools, parking lot repairs, and classroom renovations in the High School.

Again, the financial struggle with Albany continues. This year, our Governor has proposed no increases in State Aid unless his educational reform proposal is approved. This has placed an enormous burden on our office to develop a budget without firm financial information from Albany. We continue to improve our instructional programs, but without proper support from Albany, we may take a step back.

Finally, I would like to extend a huge thank you to the staff of the Hornell City School District. We have embarked on significant changes within our school system. Everyone has risen to the challenge to make our school district the best it can be. Our staff is committed to ensuring every child reaches his/her full potential by providing a high quality and well rounded educational experience for the students of our school district. I appreciate their dedication and all that they do. You should be proud of the work they are doing. When you see a staff member, please say "thank you".

It is a pleasure to have the opportunity to serve the students, staff, and community of Hornell. Thank you for your continued support and dedication to this community.

There has been a lot of activity going on this year at the GST BOCES Wildwood Campus. Many Hornell students attend classes on campus to learn and focus on a specific

Last September, six seniors went to Peebles for two consecutive Saturdays, and offered customers their hair styling and nail polishing skills. This was a nice opportunity for students in this program to practice what they learned. In November, two students volunteered to do hair braiding at the Happy Hair Station for girls participating in a 5k run. use 1100 feet of angle iron for the project. Last week, they began putting on the new top. The owner of the barges graduated in 1986 from the Wildwood Heavy Equipment

Our Nurse Assistant students are currently doing their clinical rotations at McAuley Manor. This allows them valuable experience with 'hands-on' skills as well as acquiring the necessary hours needed to take their CNA exam.

In December, the Heavy Equipment Program was asked to help expand the City of Hornell's fill site. Students used a backhoe, bulldozer, and chainsaws for this project. The Heavy Equipment program recently created their own saw mill. We are proud of the students who competed in the March Skills USA Competition. Eleven of them placed within the top three in their category.







Meet Archie Peck

Archie Peck entered the service in Hornell, New York on October 6th, 1918. He was the Hornell area's only winner of the Congressional Medal of Honor. It's the sole US decoration worn at the throat, just as the picture shows. He was honored for making repeated trips under fire during World War I to retrieve wounded comrades. After the war, Mr. Peck operated a hardware store in Sinclairville, NY. He was also active in the American Legion. Archie Peck was inducted into the Steuben County Hall of Fame on April 28, 2012.










Hornell Dodgers (1950):

The Erie Railroad Flood

On this day in 1935, western New Yorkers were reeling from sudden and gigantic overnight floods. More than forty people died region-wide, and millions of dollars were lost in property damage. As this photo shows, the Erie Railroad yards in Hornell were among those clobbered. The National Guard brought in water and set up shelters in Hornell, Hammondsport, and the surrounding area. It was very much like the Hurricane Agnes flood thirty-seven years later -- a disaster that, believe it or not, would have been far worse except for New Deal flood control projects after 1935.





BOYS TRACK & FIELD —

The Hornell Boys Outdoor Track Team had a very successful 2014 campaign. Senior captain Luke Morgan led the way for the Red Raiders. Luke won the Pole Vault at the Twin Tiers, Hornell, and Wellsville Invitationals. He was the LCAA and Section V Class B



Champion, as well. A personal record vault of 13' earned him 2nd place at the Section V State

Qualifier and a trip to the NYS Track & Field Championships where he finished 5th in the state. Senior Jake Kramer (3000M Steeplechase) and junior Wade Cone (800M) also had personal bests at the State Qualifier Meet where they finished in 7th and 4th respectively.

As a team. Hornell finished 8th out of 16 teams in Class B, and brought home three 3rd place finishes from the Twin Wellsville Hornell, Tiers. and Invitationals. Section V top finishers included Morgan Cone (1600M & 800M) and Kramer (Steeplechase & Pole Vault) as well as Zach Kellogg in the Shot (7th place) and Discus (4th place). Kellogg took home a pair of 3rd place finishes from the LCAA Meet in the Shot (43'0") and the Discus. Wade Cone also brought home three Invitational

Championships. At the Hornell Invitational, he won the 800M & the 1600M, and defended his 2013 1600M title at the Wellsville Spring Day Individual.

GIRLS TRACK & FIELD -

The girls' spring track and field program had another great season finishing with a 3-2 league record, a nailbiting 1.5 point team victory at Wellsville Spring Day, and two new school records. The first was established by Mariah Smith whose 4:59.25 broke the mythical 5:00 minute barrier in the 1500. This eclipsed the record set in 1993 by Yvonne Spellecy in the 200, and bested another long-standing record set by Beth Farrell in 1990.

The second school record was highlighted by the spectacular career of Jocelyn Acor who returned after playing softball her junior year. Jocelyn went on a tear, running 24.94 in the 200. This broke another long-standing record set by Beth Farrell in 1990. Not only was Jocelyn's performance a Hornell High School best, it is also the Livingston County and Section V Class B's top performance. The team says goodbye to Jocelyn, arguably the best sprinter in HHS history, as well as sprinter & jumper Emily Wolf, hurdler & jumper Anna Cappadonia, and thrower Tiffany Clancy.

GIRLS SOCCER -





CHEERLEADING-






"CONNECTED" by Peter Babcock '58



Peter Babcock, a native of Hornell and an HHS graduate of 1958, was born on May 23, 1940 at St. James Mercy Hospital. His high school buddies were Bob Egan, Bill & Jerry Crowe, Gary Crowley, Jim & Mike Barillo, Jerry Hancock, and teammates Alan Stook, David Guenther, Sal Fiscina, Eric Shults, Jerry Prior, Don Kelly, Jimmy Wachter, and Jim Flaitz. While a student in high school, Pete was active in track and basketball. In his last game on February 28, 1958, he scored 36 points, which at the time was a second all-time high for a single game. His sixteen baskets were a 1-game record....not bad for anyone, let alone someone that stood only 5'4" and weighed less than 120 lbs.

In February of 1960, Pete went to work for the former Erie Railroad in the clerical department in Hornell. The Erie merged railroads with Delaware, Lackawanna and Western to become the Erie-Lackawanna later that year, and eventually became Conrail in April, 1976. After several transfers, Pete accepted a manager's position in the crew dispatching office at Dearborn, Michigan in 1995. He retired from Conrail on April 1, 1997 with over thirty-seven (37) years of service.



On September 20, 1960, Pete suffered a severe appendix attack while on duty with the railroad. He was finally operated on by Dr. James R. Kelly the next day. While in recovery, his soul left his body during a near death experience. Pete was accompanied to heaven

by four Angels. When he 'returned', one Angel came with him. They had a very short but awe -inspiring thought-to-thought conversation at the ceiling of his hospital room. Pete did not wish to go back into his body. However, the Angel had other marching orders for him. His dictum was; "You must go back, Peter. It's not your time, and you have many important things to do."

From 1961—1974 with the help of the Lord and/or the Angel, Peter was instrumental in saving six peoples' lives. Many other individuals were also positively affected by some of his actions. Pete has written a book titled *CONNECTED*, chronicling all of these situations and the actions that he took. The book was published on Dec 23, 2014.

Peter was married to Jean Gottschall in September of 1962. They had four children... Michael, Susan, Scott, & Beth, and six wonderful grandchildren. Pete married Sherry Hopkins from Virginia Beach in 2004. They currently reside in Ft. Myers, Fl.

Hornell City School District 21st Century Grant Update

Staying after school isn't necessarily a bad thing in the Hornell City School District. Thanks to the 21st Century Community Learning Center Grant and the Extended School Day/School Violence Prevention Grant, the district offers various activities aimed at students in kindergarten through 12th grade. Rich Everly, 21st Century grant coordinator, is entering his fifth year in charge of the program. Tim Crowe '03 was added as Extended School Day program coordinator last year as the conditions of the grants changed.

The yearly goals for the grant include: college & career readiness; science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM); academic improvement; and success in moving forward through the educational process. Activities include groups dedicated to science, writing, reading, robotics, cooking, and learning how to play the guitar. Field trips enrich the





learning experience provided by the programs. For example, the cooking students visited Wegmans and received a private tour of the store while students taking guitar lessons from Crowe went to the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame in Cleveland. Several ongoing activities include the robotics program & competition, student-written publications, preparation for the Teen Book Festival at Nazareth College, tutoring programs, and extended library hours during the week. Crowe said there were over 4,500 instances of students using the library last year.

> Many of the activities offer a chance for students to meet fellow youngsters from other school districts, something quite valuable in a primarily rural region. "Everything is addressed in a close, private, and comfortable setting. It's a really positive one and it continues to grow," Crowe said. "It's been really rewarding to see how it benefits the students academically and socially. They're just having fun." All programs come at no cost to students or their families with the exception of a bag lunch as part of a possible field trip.



An HBO documentary that captures the daily dedication, desperation, and challenges at a suicide telephone hotline center for veterans, active personnel, & families of veterans, won the Academy Award for best documentary on February 22, 2015.

"Crisis Center: Veterans Press 1" was filmed in 2012 at the Veterans Administration Center in Canandaigua, and features Maureen McAneney McHenry, a Canandaigua resident & 1991 graduate of Hornell High School. Maureen, a responder at the crises center, is a calm, kind presence in the film, deftly handling phone calls from anguished veterans and family members. The national center receives as many as 1,000 calls each day, a brutal reminder of the emotional, personal, and physical toll that the nation's wars place on veterans and families.

Producer Dana Perry and director Ellen Goosenberg Kent accepted the Oscar during the Academy Awards Ceremony in Los Angeles. Maureen and several other cast members were present. A mother of four sons and a holder of a bachelor's degree in psychology from Brockport State, Maureen has worked at the VA hotline center for more than four years. Where does that calmness, reasonable, and reassuring professionalism come from when responding to callers? Maureen suggests that her upbringing in Hornell plays a part. She grew up in a "crazy, loving Irish home" as the youngest of eight children. Maureen credits her parents with instilling a respect and acceptance of others, no matter if there were differences in affluence, race, religion, or cultural backgrounds. Perhaps that is why she calls it an "honor" to do her job.

Thomas Baumgarten, a 1982 graduate of Hornell High School, has been appointed superintendent of the Morongo Unified School District in Joshua Tree, California. Baumgarten was appointed to the position on February 17, 2015 at the school district's Board of Trustees meeting. The appointment was unanimously passed by a 5-0 vote. Baumgarten had been serving as interim superintendent since last July when his predecessor resigned.

As the district's new top administrator, Baumgarten will oversee the daily administrative functions of a school district with over 1,100 employees serving more than 8,200 students. Seventeen schools in the district (K—12) now fall under his reign. Baumgarten outlined a single minded goal for his time as superintendent. He hopes to increase academic achievement by trying to assure that students have what they need to be successful in school, but also when they graduate.

Tom attributed much of his success as an administrator to the values he learned growing up in Hornell. ROBOTICS TEAM WINS REGIONAL TOURNAMENT

The Raiders of the Lost Robot, a team of twelve students from Hornell and surrounding school districts, recently earned a tournament win at the FIRST Robotics League Finger Lakes Qualifier at St. John Fisher College in Rochester. The team, comprised of seven students from Hornell High School, four from Alfred-Almond, and one from Arkport, successfully designed, built & programmed the robot they used at the competition in December. The win qualified the Raiders to compete with other winning teams from Upstate New York in the Empire State Championship Tournament at Pace University.

The team is affiliated with the FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) Robotics League which is an international organization that organizes and hosts robotics competitions for 40,000 teams worldwide. FIRST was created more than twenty years ago by inventor Dean Kamen as a fun and competitive way to engage more students in science & math. Many of the participants on the Raiders were introduced to robotics through Hornell's FIRST Lego team. In Hornell, both teams are part of the grant-funded Extended School Day Program.

The experience that the students gain as they prepare for competition is similar to a real-world engineering challenge, robotics coach and Hornell technology teacher Paul Woughter said. The Raiders' ability to size up and work with competing teams served them well at the competition. They went on to win the tournament.





"Big Red...Our Time": The Story of HHS Football

Playing high school football has become an annual rite of passage for thousands of adolescent boys across the United States of America as they look to shed the shackles of boyhood and morph into men. Each of these gridiron gladiators can dream of a great quarterback sack or scoring the game winning touchdown. Yet, dreams of state championships are elusive and inhabit the sleep of very few.

Embraced by overwhelming support from the Hornell community, the Red Raiders, affectionately known as "Big Red," were able to overcome the death of a teammate, and learned to believe in themselves & each other. Hornell's motto of character, perseverance, and pride became the hallmark of their lives. Yet, they never learned to surrender. Blue-ribbon players were lost to graduation, and others stepped

up to take their place.

Ultimately, our small western New York

town had to relinquish the crown in the last of their four consecutive state championship games in 2012. Yet, Big Red, having entered the New York football elite, took home three state championships, and owned the second



longest active winning streak in the nation. Robert Wiggins, along with former Hornell

football coach Gene Mastin, has published a book titled "Big Red...Our Time". It outlines the undefeated 2009, 2010, and 2011 HHS football seasons, and their three NYS Championship wins. He writes a dramatic and heart lifting memoir of the Hornell Red Raiders who defeated the odds and won a

spot in the history books. This story includes personal accounts from coaches, athletes, & community members, and gives a play-by-play of different historical games over a four-year period of time. The book was released on September 25, 2014.

Wiggins was raised in Rome, New York. For nearly forty years, he worked as a clinical pharmacist, and is now retired. He and his wife Coleen reside in Johnson City, Tennessee. 

A Special Tribute to Jackson "Jack" Amphlett

Jackson "Jack" Amphlett was born and raised in Hornell. While in grade school and junior high school, he played many sports but truly excelled in basketball. Due to an eye injury at an early age, Jack was not permitted to play organized sports in a public high school setting. With his parent's approval, he transferred to Bishop Walsh Academy in Olean, NY, and was a member of their varsity basketball program from 9^{th} - 12^{th} grade.

Jack was not only a phenomenal player but he broke many school records, received numerous awards, and was a true leader on the team. He was a 4-year starter. The team record for that period was an incredible 73 wins and only 5 losses. Jack set a senior year school record by scoring 519 points, averaging 27.6 points per game. His career total of 1178 points ranks 4th on the all-time scoring list at the school. Jack graduated from BWHS in June of 1971, and received a full scholarship to Gannon College where he was the first freshman to ever play on the varsity squad. He later transferred to Alfred University where he had a career scoring average of 17 points per game as a Saxon.

On January 29, 2015, Jack was inducted into the Bishop Walsh Sports Hall of Fame, an honor that was most deserving. Many of his former BW teammates, family members, and friends attended the





ceremony. It was a wonderful, fun, and memorable evening for everyone. Jack and his wife, the former Maureen Mahoney '72, currently reside in Rochester, NY. They have three children, Brian, Stacy, and Shannon who are very proud of their dad.

Over his three years on the baseball team, Tom had a career batting average of .356 with 7 home runs. It was during his junior year that Tom ended the season with a .403 batting average and 5 home runs. He was named MVP on the baseball team for his leadership and accomplishments during his senior year.

Tom continued his education at SUNY Cortland and worked for Conrail for 37 years before retiring in 2006. Tom and his wife, Donna, reside in Schenectady, NY.



must receive a majority vote of the committee. Voting is done by secret ballot with a maximum of six athletic inductees and a possible contributor each year.






Homecoming Festivities 2014 *





Steven A. "Steve" Lamb '71




