Years of Planning Brings a New Hospital Building



St. James leadership and staff has finally made the move after years of planning. They have moved from the century old building on Canisteo Street in the city of Hornell to a brand new, \$55 million, 87,300 square-foot facility on the medical campus at 7329 Seneca Road-North in Hornellsville.

On March 16, the old St. James Hospital was a functional hospital — patients being admitted, treatments continued, the business of healthcare proceeding normally. But by 5 p.m. just one day later — March 17 — all

was quiet inside the old healthcare relic, while 3.5 miles away, a new era has begun.

The planning has been going on for several years. State grants not only covered the cost of

building the new hospital, they paid for the new equipment and furnishings in the building, limiting the amount of "stuff" that had to be moved from Canisteo Street to Seneca Road. The new administration and staff are hopeful that they can make rural healthcare more efficient by partnering with an affiliate like the University of Rochester.







How are Scholarship **Recipients Chosen?**

The Hornell High School Alumni tradition strives to encourage and support life-styles that have strong work ethics, public service, and academic achievement by rewarding students who exemplify these characteristics with recognition and financial assistance for their education.

A silent committee serves at the pleasure of the President of the Alumni This group is always kept Board. confidential. It may come as a surprise but this is truly a secret committee and never discussed. Board members don't have a clue! A meeting is called by the Superintendent of Schools and the HHSAA President.

The silent committee, school officials, teachers, and guidance counselors meet for the first time. Every senior is offered an opportunity to fill out an application.

The Superintendent provides a detailed resume of all students: class financial need, student ranking, activities, desire for higher education (school choice), cost, student character, personality, and potential leadership

All selections are final. No records leave the school and resumes of the students are returned and kept confidential.

2019 Year In Review by Mayor John Buckley '89

The end of the year for many of us is a time for reflection upon the many accomplishments, changes and challenges experienced during the year. For the City of Hornell, 2019 was certainly full of all of those and more. If the tagline for 2018 was a "city on the move", 2019 saw that kicked up a notch with the tagline for this year being: "a city in high gear".

With a new year, often comes new leadership and the City welcomed its newest fire chief, Frank Brzozowski '80 in early January. Whenever there is new leadership in a department, that leadership brings new visions, goals and ideals to the department they lead. The fire department is certainly no different and the community saw a lot of outreach from the fire department throughout the year. We saw the fire department expand their role into EMS, hazmat, codes and education. The number of EMS calls were released daily and members of the community responded positively to knowing more of the wonderful service our paid fire department offers. In September, the fire department received a \$137,184 grant to purchase 4 cardiac defibrillators. This grant and equipment are a godsend to meet the EMS needs of our city residents.

The police department welcomed two new officers this year. In January, Officer Hamilton was sworn in as the youngest officer in department history. While, in May, Officer Thurston, officer number 390, was appointed at the age of 35. Both officers will join a quality department committed to serving the needs of this community. A large area of focus of the police department, is the commitment to keeping

drugs out of the City. The City of Hornell has earned a reputation as a place where drugs will not be tolerated. The department noted its continued commitment to efforts to crackdown on drugs noting 177 drug arrests in 2019. In April, 73 baggies of heroin were confiscated in an arrest, while in May a large meth source was taken out. and in October the K9 unit was added to the department. In February, the mayor worked with the Codes office and the Common Council crafting a new ordinance regarding landlords and their accountability for codes and safety inspection when a drug arrest occurs on their premises. The message is clear: Drugs are not welcome in Hornell. In January, the mayor's office worked very hard with the County and the City of Corning to come up with a compromised response to the Centralized Arraignment Plan mandate. compromise saved taxpayer dollars and our department from being overextended with transports to Bath for arraignment. At the end of the year, Chief Murray, Judge Coddington and City Attorney Pelych, provided the council with their impression of the impact of bail reform measures in the coming year to allow for continued advocacy regarding these unfunded mandates and their impact on our community.

While managing a budget is a pressing topic throughout the year, as the year turns anew, the focus on the new fiscal budget really heats up. 2019, like the few years before it, saw numerous challenges within the budget. The City's revenue took a big hit with real property assessment falling nearly 2 million dollars, while costs and services continue increase. The mayor's office, the City Chamberlain and the Common Council worked diligently to craft a budget to continue commitment to high quality services and infrastructure, while not levying a large increase to taxpayers. The City's commitment to maintaining affordability and high-quality services was so noteworthy that in May, the City of Hornell was rated the #3 most affordable place to live in NY while also being bestowed as the 44th safest community in March and the 2nd fastest growing city in the state in July!

A large portion of the funding for the City budget comes from AIM funding and in February, the mayor's office worked hard advocating for an increase to AIM funding at NYCOM while the governor and state legislature worked to develop the state budget. February also saw discussion regarding water usage and leaks to the water system. In March, the City completed a leak detection survey, repaired many of those leaks, saving a loss of 700,000 gallons per day! Aging infrastructure was a challenge for the City, not unlike the rest of the area, with a couple of water main breaks occurring and the diligent efforts of the city DPW team to repair them promptly and restore services to those affected.

One of the reasons Hornell is the second fastest growing city is the new businesses and development occurring within the city. The new hospital at St. James continues to work towards completion with an anticipated early 2020 opening. Housing development continues with finalized plans for the Rockland Silk Mill apartments at the old Marion Rohr building. Phase 2 planning at The Residences looks to add 4 new buildings and 84 units. BOCES completed its work on its 9th house in the City, adding a brandnew home on what was a vacant lot; increasing residential property tax revenue and adding a quality homes to our neighborhoods.

Beyond housing, there have been many, many small business openings in the City throughout the year. Folks who have been born and raised here or new to the area. double-down on their commitment to our great community by starting small business here and fulfilling their dreams. Hornell saw openings of businesses such as: 100 Main St Studios, Forever 6ix, Harmony Blue, Butterfly Kisses, the Book Bar, PKA-Drake and Pat's Pizzeria. Continued commitments with large store openings from Walgreens and Gordmans continue to indicate that Hornell is a place to invest. The IDA continues to work hard with new businesses and development. It saw a push towards making areas in Hornell Opportunity Zones to continue incentivize investment. Large businesses like Alstom and TTA saw themselves in the national spotlight with a television segment dedicated to high speed rail in the US blossoming right here in Hornell, NY. Also, staples to the City of Hornell celebrated milestones to their businesses and commitment within the City. In March, Mr.

Lou celebrated 50 years in business and in October, Bishop and Johnson funeral home celebrated 40 years in business. Finally, in December the Texas Café celebrated an amazing 100 years of business in the City of Hornell!

To support the 2nd fastest growing city, there was a continued support in infrastructure. 2019 saw bids for the Bridge NY program come in under budget with bridge restoration, repair or replacement at Seneca St, Canisteo St and East Main St expected in the upcoming year. CBDG funds for sewer relining also came in under budget and those funds were able to be used to expand sewer lining to protect aging infrastructure against failure. The Water Pollution Control Plant continues to make good use of the recently installed bar screen and works to bring UV treatment to the plant with a \$1 million grant approved in December of 2019. The Water Treatment Plant continued its work towards improved infrastructure with work beginning in summer of 2019 to construct a new water storage tank.

While unfortunately, much of the infrastructure improvements are unseen, there have been many improvements that are very evident. Summer of 2019 saw increased paving throughout the city, as well as beyond, into Hornellsville with the paving of route 36 connecting the city to the Hornell Plaza as well as a commitment to freshen up the appearance of Broadway with the removal of shrubs and plans for new landscaping to areas within the City. In December, residents in the Hornell area welcomed new Christmas decorations to downtown Hornell, with beautiful lighted wreaths lining the light posts improving Hornell's attractiveness for area shoppers and residents.

We also saw a commitment and honoring of those that live here that have served our country with the unveiling of the Hometown Heroes program in May of 2019. City residents that have served our country, have banners proudly displayed in high traffic areas throughout the city, honoring their commitment to our country.

Furthering the commitment to youth as well as anyone looking to advance their education, the Mayor's office coordinated efforts with the Hornell City School district as well as Corning Community College and in June it was announced that select

college classes and programs would be offered through CCC right here in the City of Hornell. This commitment to access to advanced education will serve our community well and is likely to grow and expand in the coming years.

Much of what makes our community special are those that live and work here. Outstanding city employees were recognized with employee recognition several times throughout the year. 2019 saw some retirements of from City Hall and the police department. Missy Logan was appointed as the new City Clerk, Amy Patrick was named Executive Assistant to the Mayor and Jennifer MacLaughlin was hired as assistant to the Police Chief, respectively. In June, the city also honored the lifetime commitment of Anne and Seth Corwin with a plague and dedication fittingly bestowed at the bus shelter at Lot #3 for their commitment to transit services in the City of Hornell.

The City of Hornell really shines in March and 2019 was no exception with record crowds and attendance to St Patrick's day. Hornell officially named the month of March, "Irish American Heritage Month" in celebration of its Irish Heritage and largest event. St Patrick's day has some competition from other festivals in the city as in September, the City partnered with HPG for the first annual Fall Festival on September 28th. Hundreds lined the streets with this event likely only to grow in future years. Also, the Hornell for the Holidays saw record attendance and responses to events in the holiday season making Hornell one of the destinations in the southern tier for Christmas celebration.

The best was saved for last in Hornell this year as events in the fourth quarter. really made 2019 a year to remember in Hornell history. For the past four years, the Planning Office has worked very hard in its application for the Downtown Revitalization Initiative where \$10 million is given to 10 communities throughout the state. On October 10th, Lt. Governor Kathy Hochul was on hand to present Hornell as the winner for the Southern Tier this year! Words cannot express the gratitude and excitement that comes with this grant. The grant rewards the hard work and commitment already provided to the City and plans to take that to the next level. This grant will catapult Hornell into the next century and beyond and continue to

accelerate the growth and resurgence already occurring in Hornell.

Unfortunately, the month of November saw two tragedies in our community. The first was the homicide at the ARC home on Elm St and the second being an eighthome fire on Preston Ave and Washington Street displacing many families. While these events undoubtedly shook the City, the adversity showed our strength and commitment during trying times. Our police dept handled events with unwavering integrity and arrested the suspect within minutes. Our fire department with mutual aid from area volunteer departments contained the fire, while our citizens worked to help those that needed it most. While November of 2019 could be some of the worst of times, it was also the best of times as the heart of Hornell shone brightly during that time and it is a time of which I could not be more proud.

After much deliberation throughout the year, the Common Council in working with City department heads, union representatives and the mayor's office solidified their discussion regarding the 20+ year old residency requirement for city employees. In November, the requirement was amended to a 15-mile radius with the goal to improve recruitment and retention for city employees. As the City grows and changes, it will be necessary to continue to have the best of the best to serve, protect and provide services to the City of Hornell.

The year rounded out with history being made at the fire department with the first female firefighter, Jackie Lewis, being appointed to the department. She will undoubtedly bring great things to the department, as will new fireman Cameron McConnell. The City also saw grants for sewer relining for Delaware and East Ave from CDBG for \$567,000, as well as \$84,352 for the trail extension of the Shawmut Trail to the Finger Lakes Trails.

As you can see, 2019 brought many, many wonderful things to our community. We are blessed and fortunate to live in this community where we enjoy high quality services provided by high quality people. Hornell is on track to start the new decade off right with its current growth and trajectory. As we moved into high-gear this year, it's incredible to look back throughout to view all of what's happened and look forward to all of what is to come.

From then on, that Hornell team started their reign over NYS, finishing with a 13-0 overall record and beating Nanuet 16-14 in the Class B finals to give HHS its very first NYS Championship.

Ten years later the 2009 Red Raiders, along with coach Gene Mastin, re-assembled at Maple City Park to be honored once more in front of a packed stadium. Over 20 members of that 2009 team made the trip back into town to not only be honored, but to see old teammates and reminisce about that fateful season.





End of an Era

After 20 years of calling the Hornell Police Department her second home, Ellen Andrus Stewart '75 enjoyed every day she went to work as the administrative assistant to the chief of police. Her two-decade run came to an end with a surprise sendoff put together

by her police family as she called it a career.

Pete Mankletow '06




Connor O'Rourke, Zach Miles and Collin Burdette named Livingston were County All Stars and Justin D'Amato was named to the exceptional Senior team.

This year the Lady Red Raiders began their season under a new coaching staff, Aubri Mosier took over as the Head Coach with Jen Kellogg as a volunteer assistant. With the roster being about 50% freshman and only four out of eleven players being returning athletes, this season was truly a building year for the program. With such a young team with little to no varsity experience it was




VOLLEYBALL

WRESTLING







Smith's Stock Farm, Inc.—Going Robotic

Smith's Stock Farms Inc., in Hornell, NY, has stepped in to the 21st century where 11 DeLaval robotic milking systems (RMS) have recently been installed. Seventh-generation dairyman Aaron Smith, class of 94' states "We decided to go with robots because of the labor situation,". The farm, about 2,100 acres, was originally established in 1832 on 52 acres. Brothers Lowell and Dale Smith are current owners at the farm. Lowell's son Aaron, class of '94, along with Andrew, Class of '95 and Chris Passero, are slated as being future owners of the Steuben County dairy. Smith's began milking with 10 robots in April 2018 and added an additional robot last year, with 11 robots milking nearly 600 Holsteins. It took about 2 weeks to train the various groups of cows to get used to using the robots. "We have to fetch them to get them used to going through," Lowell said. "As soon as they get a taste of the grain they are usually pretty astute about coming back." explained that labor wasn't the only reason the farm went to robotics. Other milking system updates were needed and when looking at the big picture, robotics seemed to be the answer. Construction for the new system began in June 2017.





Time piece: 45-year-old paper turns up in North Hornell

Second-grade students in 1954-55 bury jar that turns up when a new home is built

NORTH HORNELL — It NORTH HORNELL — It looks like a baby-food jar, with a metal lid rusted beyond recognition. Inside is a folded up piece of school notebook paper, paie blue lines still visible against the yellowing white.

The glass jar is a time capsule, buried inside what used to be the old North Hornell School along Seneca Road. The jar was found intact — amazingly enough — as the building was being



demolished last year by contrac-tor Mike Caruso, in order to build his new home there. The paper inside is from the North Hornell school's 2nd-grade class in 1954-55, taught

by Gladys Dunton, who at 98 years old, is believed to be residyears out, is believed to be lessi-ing in the Canandaigua area. It is signed by her 21 students. Among those on the list is Walt Rutski, Jr. When he learned


Mary Eileen Gleason Connors '56
